Lifebanc Engages Cleveland Clinic to Provide Medical Director Support
Medical Directors will also support local intensive care doctors in communicating with families

CLEVELAND (Jan. 30, 2024) – Lifebanc, Northeast Ohio's organ procurement organization, engaged Cleveland Clinic to provide medical director services on behalf of Lifebanc for the region beginning Feb. 1. These new services aim to expand assistance to physicians caring for patients at the end of life who may be eligible for organ donation. A team of Cleveland Clinic's adult and pediatric intensive care physicians will now be on call as Lifebanc Medical Directors during times when they are not caring for patients.

The medical director on call will review organ suitability and advise on an appropriate path forward and support local physicians throughout the region. The expansion of medical director roles allows for an additional layer of guidance as the medical director will be able to provide specialized clinical expertise for all locations served by Lifebanc.

The Medical Directors have also received specialized training focused on how to support intensive care physicians who are caring for patients who may be eligible donors, ensuring they can help families make informed decisions.

"We are committed to ensuring that every family has the opportunity to consider organ donation by facilitating meaningful and open communication," said Beri Ridgeway, M.D., Chief of Staff at Cleveland Clinic. "We must honor donor decisions and empower families to make informed choices regarding organ donation while maintaining the highest ethical standards."

The physicians will have the ability to provide support to hospitals across Northeast Ohio and all locations served by Lifebanc.

"This innovative collaboration marks a significant milestone in our commitment to expanding support for patients during their end-of-life care in Northeast Ohio," explains Gordon Bowen, CEO at Lifebanc. "By harnessing the expertise of these intensive care doctors, our Medical Directors will be able to provide an invaluable layer of guidance, ensuring optimal care and consideration for organ donation eligibility."

Lifebanc serves over 4 million people and works with 80 hospitals in a 20-county area facilitating organ, eye and tissue recovery. While life-saving transplants have been increasing, there remains a significant shortage of donor organs. Currently, there are more than 100,000 people waiting for an organ transplant across the country and more than 3,000 waiting in Ohio.
